Lucius was arrested and booked into the Bossier Parish Jail as a result of a joint investigation between Attorney General Jeff Landry's Cyber Crime Unit, Bossier City Marshal's Office, Bossier Parish Sheriff's Office, Bossier Police Department, Bossier Narcotics Task Force, Caddo Parish Sheriff's Office, Shreveport Police Department, United States Marshal's Office Task Force, Louisiana State Police, and Homeland Security Investigations.

Stephen Harris, 24 of Shreveport, was arrested on one count of Possession of Pornography Involving Juveniles. Harris was arrested and booked into the Shreveport City Jail as a result of a joint investigation between Attorney General Jeff Landry's Cyber Crime Unit, Bossier City Marshal's Office, Bossier Parish Sheriff's Office, Bossier Police Department, Caddo Parish Sheriff's Office, Louisiana State Police, and Homeland Security Investigations.
